The answers to all of your questions about Camp Avalanche

Payments: You may pay in full or pay a \$50 deposit to reserve a spot for your child. A deposit must be paid for each week in which you wish to reserve a spot for your child. If you pay a deposit, the remainder is due at the start of each camp week. If you paid the deposit by check you must mail in a check with the balance before the deadline for each week. **If you paid a deposit by credit card, your card will automatically be charged the balance due, at the start of the camp week.** The deposit is non-refundable inside of the 30 day cancellation period. The deposit is transferable to other weeks if you are unable to attend the week that you signed up for. In order to transfer your deposit you must notify the Camp Director one week prior. There are no daily fees. **Receipts should be picked up at check-in.**

Hours of Operation: From 9:00am – 4:00pm there will be programmed activities. Drop-off time is between 8:00 – 9:00am and pick-up is between 4:00pm – 5:00pm. You may pick your child up and drop them off at any time, but you will need to check your daily schedule (given out the first day of camp and posted on the website each Friday of the preceding week) because we may be in the middle of an activity or off-site. A few field trips may require that you have your child at camp before 9:00am and/or pick up after 5:00pm. A fee of **\$1/ minute** will be assessed if you are late picking up your child. Please see the Terms & Conditions for late fees.

Daily Schedule: An hour by hour schedule for the week will be posted on the website by Friday of the preceding week.

Lunch: Campers should bring a sack lunch with a drink everyday that does not require refrigeration. We will provide a morning and an afternoon snack for all campers. Lunch arrangements will be made with local vendors information will be out mid-May.

Ice Skating: This is a general day camp and skating is just one of our many activities. We do skate every afternoon and on Mondays all campers who are interested will receive a free group lesson with a Professional Chaparral coach. Campers have the opportunity to enroll in the Blizzard Blitz Program al la carte at a significant discount. See below for more details.

Blizzard Blitz: The Learn To Skate program will provide a half hour lesson each day during camp skating time. The fee for campers is only \$10 per lesson, regular price is \$20 per lesson.

Skates: Rental skates are provided at no extra cost. Campers may bring their own skates, if they have them. There are coin-operated daily lockers (\$.50 per use) in the lobby where kids can store their skates during the day.

What to wear: Campers should wear comfortable play clothes and closed-toe shoes and socks. Keep in mind we will have some outdoor activities each day and we will also be on the ice each day. Camper **MUST** pack warm clothes, gloves and a helmet for the ice.

What to bring: Pack warm clothes for ice skating each day. Send a swimsuit, towel and sunscreen on days outlined in schedule. You should also send a water bottle or sports drink each day. **Remember to label** all of your belongings. Chaparral Ice is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

What not to bring: We discourage bringing toys of any kind to camp. Gameboys, CD players, action figures, etc. are near and dear to us all and we would hate to see them misplaced or broken.

Camp Counselors: Your child's safety is a priority at Chaparral Ice Center. We require our counselors to go through an extensive training program which includes a general camp counselor training and the following certifications: CPR, First Aid, Community Water Safety, Child Abuse Prevention and Blood-borne pathogens. Camp Sub Zero is licensed by the Texas Department of Health. It is our policy to maintain a 10:1 camper to counselor ratio.

Refunds: There is a 30-day cancellation policy. Refunds requested more than 30 days prior to the start date for a particular camp session will be processed **minus a \$20 non-refundable administrative fee.** If you cancel within 30 days of the start date, the \$50 deposit is forfeited. The only exceptions made to the above policies will be for long term illness or injury. All medical refund requests must be submitted with a doctor's statement to the Camp Director. A \$20 non-refundable administrative fee will be deducted plus a prorated amount for each day of camp attended. Camp fees and deposits are transferable to other weeks if requested one week prior to the start of that particular camp week and on a space available basis.

Liability: In case of sickness or accident, Chaparral Ice has my approval to secure, at my expense, such medical attention as deemed necessary, if unable to contact me. • My child is in good physical condition and has my permission to participate in all camp activities. • I authorize my child to travel to/from camp activities in transportation arranged by Chaparral Ice. • Space is limited and is first come first serve. Chaparral Ice reserves the right to cancel or close any camp sessions. • Campers assume the risks and agree that Chaparral Ice and its staff are not responsible for injury to the camper or for loss or damage to personal property. • At all times the camper shall be liable for personal injury and/or property damage or loss incurred while on the premises and the camper agrees to defend and hold Chaparral Ice Center, its officers, agents and employees harmless against any and all liability for claims, demands and causes of camper's use, maintenance and operation of the facilities or otherwise upon the premises or from the camper's negligence during the term of this agreement. Vaccination records are required from all Campers prior to attending camp.
